## Sikh hijackers free hostages

DUBAI, United Arab Emirates (AP) - A 37-hour hijack ordeal

ended yesterday when seven militant Sikhs released 79 hostages from an Indian Airlines jet in return for a week's asylum in Dubai and a pledge to help them get to United States.

A U.S. official in Dubai said the United States was unlikely to ac-

cept them.

The freed hostages looked tired, but they said they had been treated well by their armed captors. Officials said the hijackers — who were taken into protective custody — had threatened to kill one passenger every half-hour and blow up the twin-engine Boeing 737.

The plane had 93 people aboard when it was seized Friday after leaving Chandigarh in India, a stop on its flight from New Delhi, to Srinagar. It stopped in Lahore and Karachi, Pakistan, before landing in Dubai. SikhMuseum.com
